Preface

When the Lord Jesus Christ established His Church, Jesus ordained for His disciples in the Church assembly to be the source of His glory and His truth in the world until He returns. Jesus Christ is the only foundation of His Church (1 Corinthians 3:11), but it is due to the faithful planting and watering of previous ministers in years past and God's subsequent blessing of increase (1 Corinthians 3:6-7) that the Church of the Lord Jesus Christ remains here today in this locale at Macedonia. It is our prayer that we can faithfully continue what the Lord has begun at Macedonia Church and others have diligently followed as well. The command of God to those

like myself who come later to serve and to continue this blessed work that the Lord began is a very sobering message to take heed in the manner that we attempt to build upon what has already been established: "According to the grace of God which is given unto me, as a wise masterbuilder, I have laid the foundation, and another buildeth thereon. But let every man take heed how he buildeth thereupon." (1 Corinthians 3:10).

In the church, in salvation, in our daily lives, there is only One source of our blessings,, and consequently there is only One who is worthy of our praise. "That, according as it is written, He that glorieth, let him glory in the Lord." (1 Corinthians 1:31). Church Constitution

History Leading up to the Church Constitution

The Town of Ackerman, Mississippi, was chartered in early 1884 due to growth in the region from the railroad. Among the influx of new residents from the railroad were a group of disciples of Christ who believed and held to the Original, Old Line, or Primitive Baptist faith.

Fairview Primitive Baptist Church was constituted on July 17, 1886, in Choctaw County, Mississippi, with three original members, holding letters of dismissal from Friendship Primitive Baptist Church.

Around one year later, on July 31, 1887, one of the founding members of Fairview Church, Brother J.P. Robinson, along with four other likeminded saints also with letters of dismissal from Fairview Church, met together with a Presbytery of three elders to constitute Macedonia Primitive Baptist Church near to Brother J.P. Robinson's home in Choctaw County. The land for the church building was donated by I.S. (Isaac) Baker, just a few miles north of Ackerman, Mississippi. Macedonia Church was constituted only three years after the Town of Ackerman was originally chartered.

<u>Original Church Covenant of</u> <u>Macedonia Primitive Baptist Church</u>

We the following named Brethren and Sisters holding letters of dismissal from Fairview Church, viz: J.P. Robinson, N.J. Robinson, Isaac Baker, Jermia Baker, and G.M. Franklin, who have first given ourselves to the Lord and to each other, do hereby covenant and agree to be constituted into a church to be known by the name of Macedonia; we further mutually promise and covenant to watch over each other for good and to keep house for the Lord.

Church Constitution (Continued)

<u>Minutes of the Constitution of</u> <u>Macedonia Primitive Baptist Church</u>

State of Mississippi, Choctaw County July 31, 1887

We the undersigned Presbytery, to wit: Elders J.B. Chambers, C.M. Scroggins, and J.E. Dorris, met according to previous appointment for the purpose of constituting a church near Brother J.P. Robinson's known as Macedonia, and after motion and second, Brother C.M. Scroggins was appointed Moderator and J.E. Dorris Clerk; whereupon, the Moderator called the Presbytery to order and went into conference by prayer by the Moderator and after read the Covenant and Agreement which was received and endorsed: then the Abstract of Faith was read and the Brethren and Sisters were examined thereupon and found to be sound and were endorsed. Motion and second that the same be received; then the Moderator read the Rules of Decorum and there was motion and second that they be received, after which the following named Brethren and Sisters came forward: J.P. Robinson, I.S. Baker, G.M. Franklin, and Sisters J.E. Baker and N.J. Robinson, who were received and the right hand of fellowship was extended and the charge given by Brother J.B. Chambers.

Macedonia Through the Years

Notable Events

On July 31, 1887, a Presbytery of three Elders meet together with five constituting church members to constitute Macedonia Primitive Baptist Church near Ackerman, Mississippi. Macedonia Church was organized near to the home of Brother J.P. Robinson in Choctaw County.

The church building was originally built on what came to be known as Macedonia Road on land that had been donated by Brother Isaac Baker, a constituting member of the church. A church cemetery – which still remains on Macedonia Road – was designated during this time for the burial of the deceased members of Macedonia Church.

In 1927, Macedonia Church extended an arm of the church to worship at the Smith School House in Cleveland, Mississippi, which in 1930, was constituted into New Prospect Primitive Baptist Church.

Macedonia Church met for worship services one Sunday weekend a month from 1887 to 1970. The meeting weekend fluctuated between 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Sunday throughout those years. Then in 1970, the church began to meet met on 1st and 3rd weekends on Saturday night and Sunday mornings.

In July 1987, Macedonia Church voted to begin holding services every Sunday and discontinue Saturday night services. This occurred 100 years, even to the same month, after the church was originally constituted. The church has continued to meet every Sunday since that time.

Notable Events

The church has hosted her special Annual Meeting each year since its constitution, fluctuating between a few months. The Annual Meeting finally settled on the 1st weekend in October and is still observed during that same weekend. In 2006, Macedonia Church voted to host a new open Fellowship Meeting to be held annually on the 4th weekend in February.

Macedonia Church continued to worship at her original location for around 60 years. Below is a picture of the original church building on Macedonia Road.



Around 1948, the church building was relocated about two miles north from her original location on Macedonia Road to Staten Road just at the corner of Highway 15. The church sanctuary on Staten Road was constructed with brick siding.

Notable Events

Below is a picture of the brick siding church that was constructed in 1948 on Staten Road.



In 1970, a new church building was constructed on Staten Road with the white vinyl siding building that still remains as the current church building. The church still continues to worship in this same church building on Staten Road currently in 2017. A picture of the current church building is on the front of this booklet.

In 1985, Macedonia Church added the kitchen and fellowship hall onto the back of the church sanctuary.

In 2008, Macedonia Church constructed another addition to the fellowship hall, adding additional room for tables and new bathrooms to accommodate increased capacity and visitors in hosting the annual Fellowship Meeting.

Deacons of Macedonia

In Macedonia Church's 130 years, 15 men have been ordained by the church to serve in the office of deacon. Brother J.P. Robinson and Brother Isaac Baker were both constituting members of Macedonia Church and later served as deacons as well. We are extremely grateful for the steadfast commitment of these brethren to humbly serve the church in this appointed office.

Meeting Times

Macedonia meets every Sunday at 10:30am, with singing, prayer, and preaching, followed by a fellowship lunch each week.

In conjunction with Sulphur Springs Primitive Baptist Church (Caledonia, Mississippi) and Elder Joe Nettles (Pastor of Sulphur Springs PBC), Elder David Wise hosts a weekly Wednesday night worship service beginning at 6:00pm at the La Quinta Inn in Starkville, Mississippi. The weekly Wednesday night Starkville meeting began in September 2014.

Annual Meetings

Macedonia hosts her Annual Meeting on the 1st Sunday weekend in October every year, and also hosts an open Fellowship Meeting on the 4th Sunday Weekend in February each year.

Communion

Macedonia observes the Communion service – with the Lord's Supper and washing of the saints' feet – on the 2^{nd} Sunday in July, annually.

Gospel of Grace Radio Broadcast

In September 2015, the Lord opened a door for Macedonia Primitive Baptist Church to produce a local radio program based out of Starkville, Mississippi. In conjunction with Sulphur Springs Primitive Baptist Church (Caledonia, Mississippi), Elder David Wise (Pastor of Macedonia PBC) and Elder Joe Nettles (Pastor of Sulphur Springs PBC) co-host a weekly radio program entitled the "Gospel of Grace Radio Broadcast" on WLZA 96.1 FM out of Starkville, Mississippi, airing every Sunday morning at 8:00am.

WLZA is a 40,000-watt station that broadcasts out of Starkville, Mississippi. The broadcast area of WLZA extends throughout most of Northeast Mississippi and some areas of far West Alabama. The broadcast coverage area of the radio station extends from Carrollton, MS to Vernon, AL (from east to west) and from Tupelo, MS to Philadelphia, MS (from north to south). A website and iTunes Podcast was also established to distribute the messages from the radio program.

Articles of Faith

- 1. We believe in one true and living God, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost, and these three are one. (1 John 5:7, John 1:1)
- 2. We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, King James Translation, are the Word of God, and the only rule of faith and practice. (2 Peter 1:21, 2 Timothy 3:16)
- 3. We believe that God, before the foundation of the world, chose a definite number of the human race in Christ Jesus to salvation and they, in particular, are redeemed. (1 Peter 1:2, Ephesians 1:4-5)
- 4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin that Adam's fall in the garden plunged his entire posterity into death in trespasses and sins and that man cannot, of his own free will and ability, recover himself from the fallen state that he is in by nature. (Romans 5:12, Genesis 2:17, Romans 4:16, John 6:44)
- 5. We believe that sinners are justified only through the merits and power of the obedience, death, and resurrection of Christ Jesus imputed to them. (Acts 20:28, Revelation 5:9, Romans 4:11)
- 6. We believe that God's elect shall be called, regenerated, justified, and glorified by the Holy Spirit and that the saints will be preserved by grace and never fall finally away. (Romans 8:29-30, 2 Timothy 1:9, John 10:27-29, 1 Peter 1:23)
- 7. We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper and feet washing are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only proper subjects and the proper mode of baptism is by immersion. (Matthew 3:16, Mark 1:10, Romans 6:4, Ephesians 4:5, John 13:14-16)

Articles of Faith (Continued)

- 8. We believe that Jesus Christ who is the Head and Lawgiver has instituted the ordinance of baptism and the Lord's Supper, which are to be perpetually observed by the Church to the end of the world. (Isaiah 33:22, James 4:12, John 13:17)
- 9. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and eternal judgment and that the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be everlasting. (John 5:28-29, 1 Corinthians 15:19, Daniel 12:2)
- 10. We believe that no minister has a right to the administration of the ordinances except those who have been regularly baptized and called of God and have come under the imposition of hands by a presbytery and that only so long as they continue in the faith once delivered to the saints. (Acts 13:2-3, Titus 1:5-6)
- 11. We know, from experience, that no good can result to the church from any secret organization; therefore, we declare non-fellowship with those who participate or engage in secret organizations of any kind. (John 18:20-21, Ephesians 5:11-13, Matthew 5:14-16)
