FROM THE PASTORS DESK

Where would be without our Saviour, Jesus Christ? We would still be unsaved from our sins and hell bound. We could not do anything good because Jesus said, "...without me ye can do nothing." (John 15:5) We would be without the gospel because there would be no good news to declare. We would be void of the church because Jesus was the Rock upon which the church was built. However, thanks be to God that we do have the miraculous conception, birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Miraculous Conception: Every human being brought into this world is conceived by some kind of union between a man and woman. Sin is transmitted through the man to their offspring. David himself said, "Behold, I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me." (Psalm 51:5) Jesus, however, was not conceived in sin as he would have been had it been because of union of Joseph and Mary. The angel told Joseph, "...fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Ghost." (Matt. 1:20) She would bring forth a son which would be called Jesus for He would save His people from their sins. He could not accomplish this mission without being sinless. He was the clean thing that came out of an unclean (Mary) thing.

Miraculous Birth: Millions of men have been born since the first birth of Cain and they have all been born of sinful parents; therefore, they had to be sinners. Although Jesus was born of a sinful, unclean woman, this woman was a virgin who had never known man in a carnal way. This miraculous birth had been prophesied hundreds of years before it actually happened. "Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." (Isa. 7:14) Matthew tells us that this Immanuel is to be interpreted "God with us." (Matt. 1:23) Jesus was God manifest in the flesh. Paul tells us about this miraculous birth and the purpose for whitch it was intended: "But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law, To redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons." (Gal. 4:4-5) Jesus was a child born and a son given and His name was to be called, Wonderful, Counseller, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, and The Prince of Peace. (Isa. 9:6)

Miraculous Death: Every individual's death is a result of sin; there's nothing miraculous about that except that the Spirit returns to God for the child of God. Man is without any power in the day of death as the scripture declares, "There is no man that hath power over the spirit to retain the spirit; neither hath he power in the day of death ... " (Eccl. 8:8) The enemies of Jesus had attempted to seize Him and kill Him more than once, but He slipped right through their midst because "His hour was not yet come." Jesus had all power in heaven and earth and had power over His own death. Jesus said concerning His life and death, "No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This commandment have I received of my Father." (John 10:18) Jesus died before the normal time it took a man to die under crucifixion. When Joseph of Arimathaea came and begged the body of Jesus, we read, "And Pilate marvelled if he were already dead: and calling unto him the centurion, he asked him whether he had been any while dead." (Matt. 15:44) Every man's death is a result of sin; Jesus' death was a result of sin, not His but the sins of His people which were laid on Him and thus He died.

Miraculous Resurrection: There had been other people resurrected from death in the Bible, but all these lived only to die again. Not only was this true, but it was another power exerted upon them to restore natural life. Jesus had power, not only over His death, but over the grave. He was always the Son of God; however, His resurrection declared Him to be the Son of God. "Concerning his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, which was made of the seed of David according to the flesh; And declared to be the Son of God with power, according to the spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead:" Rom. 1:3-4) Jesus was never to die again because what He did never had to be repeated, contrary to Old Testament practice for sin atonement. "Knowing that Christ being raised from the dead dieth no more; death hath no more dominion over him. For in that he died, he died unto sin once: but in that he liveth, he liveth unto God." (Rom. 6:9-10)

Miraculous Return: Jesus' return from heaven will be just as miraculous as his conception, birth, death and resurrection. His home going was visible and in His return the Bible says, "...every eye shall see Him..." (Rev. 1:7) Praise God! (Elder Larry Wise)

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JESUS CHRIST WAS A MINISTER By Elder Herman Clark Iuka, Mississippi

I often read in history of Primitive Baptists Ministers' lives which consisted of many hardships, trials, and tribulations they faced. It makes me ashamed of myself in many ways. Of all the ministers that we have a history, the apostles, even the prophets of old, there is one that stands out as the greatest among men. This man was also a minister. Of all the ministers down through the pages of time there has never been nor ever will be a minister liken unto this man. He was/is the Son of God and the Son of man. His name is Jesus Christ, The Son of The Living God. Paul gives us an exhortation found in Romans 15:8, "Now I say that Jesus Christ was a minister of the circumcision for the truth of God, to confirm the promises made unto the fathers:" Paul taught that Jesus was a minister of the Jews and that was for the truth of God. John said, in 1:10-11, "He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not. He came unto his own, and his own received him not." According to man's reasoning, the Jews should have been the happiest people in the world; to have Jesus as their minister. But they received not the minister that God sent into the world. This shows the depravity of man. Much could be said along this line of thinking.

When Paul stated "Now I say that Jesus Christ was a minister of the circumcision for the truth of God, to confirm the promises made unto the fathers;" And if that was all that was said, then we Gentiles would be of all people most miserable. Christ did confirm the

promises made unto the fathers. Those fathers were Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. The promises were not only to the fathers of the Jews but to a people that were alienated from God. Eph. 2:11-12, "Wherefore remember, that ye being in time past Gentiles in the flesh, who are called Uncircumcision by that which is called the Circumcision in the flesh made by hands; That at that time ve were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope, and without God in the world:" Once again what if Paul had stopped writing at the end of verse 12? Ah, but dear children, Paul wrote more. Paul wrote in verse 13, "But now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ." Read the rest of Eph. Chapter 2, to see the promises fulfilled and how we as Gentiles were brought in and included in the promises of God. Paul said that we were made nigh. He did not say that we are to make ourselves nigh, but teaches us that we were made nigh by the BLOOD OF CHRIST.

Oh, what a message for God's dear children. We have been made nigh unto God. The word "nigh" has the meaning; "of place and position." Where is our place today? Where is our position? We are at the right hand of the Lord; we are the sheep of his pasture. Jews and Gentiles are as one in Christ Jesus. What a great message manifested by the greatest minister of all, Jesus Christ, which message of olden times was fulfilled when Jesus took upon Himself flesh and was made in the likeness of men, (without sin) died on the cross, planted in the tomb, but was raised again on the third day which declared that we were made just in the eyes of the Heavenly Father. Hallelujah, what a Saviour!

In Romans 15:9-12 teaches more about Jesus Christ who was a minister. Paul said "And that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy; as it is written, For this cause I will confess to thee among the Gentiles, and sing unto thy name. And again he saith, Rejoice, ye Gentiles, with his people And again, Praise the Lord, all ye Gentiles; and laud him, all ye people. And again, Esaias saith, There shall be a root of Jesse, and he that shall rise to reign over the Gentiles; in him shall the Gentiles trust."

I am glad that Paul spoke of the promises made unto the fathers, but also he did not stop teaching that Jesus was just a minister to them, but also to the Gentiles. Read all of Matthew 20th chapter. Jesus said in 20:20-22 *"Then came to him the mother of Zebedee's children with her sons, worshipping him, and desiring a certain thing of him. And he said unto her, What wilt thou? She saith unto him, Grant that these my two sons may sit, the one on thy right hand, and the other on the left, in thy kingdom. But Jesus answered and said, Ye know not what ye ask..."* Jesus addressed this woman concerning her request and summed it up with the words in verse 23 *"...but* to sit on my right hand, and on my left, is not mine to give, but it shall be given to them for whom it is prepared of my Father." Jesus taught her in verse 26 "But it shall not be so among you: but whosoever will be great among you, let him be your minister; And whosoever will be chief among you, let him be your servant Even as the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many."

Paul teaches us in his letter to the Philippians 2:5-8, "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross." I read in history of those that willingly gave their lives to stand for the truth and not deny the Lord Jesus Christ. I wonder sometime if I were put to the test would I stand. I would hope so.

I close with verse 13 (Rom. 15) as Paul states these words: "Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy Ghost." May we be joyful and lay down in peace along life's way because of our Minister, Jesus Christ.

DEPARTURES

The dictionary defines depart or departure: "go away; die; diverge; stray from."

Paul in his first letter to Timothy says, 1st Timothy 4:1-2 "Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils; Speaking lies in hypocrisy; having their conscience seared with a hot iron;" In the above two verses, Paul says much about departures which we have seen introduced among the Lord's people down through the generations. It is no great surprise when one of the religious orders of the world takes hold of one of these departures. What hurts and causes much distress is when one or more of the membership of the Primitive Baptists begins to believe and advocate one of these departures. One of the most disturbing of these departures is the idea that is being advocated, that all the elect of God will eventually hear and obey the gospel. Nothing could be further from the truth. The mainstream Primitive Baptists have always believed and taught that God reaches His elect by His Holy Spirit, even in the far distant heathen lands of this earth. I well remember when I was a youngster growing up on the farm, when we were not having services at our home church, I would attend services with my buddies at a little country church of another faith. The Sunday school teacher was a WWII veteran of the Seabees (the engineering branch of the Navy). He would tell us stories about the natives of the South Pacific who were so unlearned that they did not know their name or how old they were. Yet they had a beautiful altar where they went and worshipped on a regular basis. I have often wished that I could be in that Sunday school class again. I could now tell them that God had given those natives a heart to know Him. See Jeremiah 24:7. No doubt, those natives of the South Pacific had never heard a gospel sermon, yet because God elected them and by His Holy Spirit, touched and tendered their hearts, they will enjoy Heaven and all its glory.

When we hear a once sound preacher begin advocating one of these departures, we cannot help but wonder why they are no longer satisfied with the goodness of the Lord's house. Whether it be a strange doctrine or a foreign practice, it is a departure. Solomon called these departures "little foxes that spoil the vine, for our vines have tender grapes." A little fox is a cute little creature, but he is still a fox. Give him half a chance, and he will steal your chickens. Corner him and he will bite you. The vine, of which Solomon speaks, is no doubt, prophecy of the coming of the New Testament church. The tender grapes I believe are the babes in Christ who are the most easily influenced by those seemingly harmless departures, (little foxes), The spoiling of the vine must be having reference to the corrupting of a local church by the introduction of false doctrines and practices.

Christ and the Apostles gave us the order of worship, preaching, praying, singing, the communion service and the feet washing service. I believe if all who profess to be Primitive Baptists, would be satisfied with the example Jesus and the Apostles left on record for us, and the preachers would be content to preach Christ and Him crucified, we would see great peace reign among our people.

The Apostle Paul, in pleading his case before King Agrippa, referring to the sacred promise of God: "Unto which promise our twelve tribes, instantly serving God day and night, hope to come. For which hope's sake. King Agrippa, I am accused of the Jews. Why should it be thought a thing incredible with you, that God should raise the dead?" The promise of redemption, and deliverance from death and the grave, was in Christ Jesus, whom God promised to send into the world! This was according to the eternal purpose, which God the Father, promised in Christ Jesus our Lord! Hosea 13:14, "I will ransom them from the power of the grave; I will redeem them from death: O death, I will be thy plagues; O grave, I will be thy destruction: repentance shall be hid from mine eyes." The Spirit of Prophecy is the Spirit of Christ. When he said, "Repentance shall be hid from mine eyes," That means, Christ Jesus will not turn away, forsake and leave undone, that which He said "I will do!" He gave His life a ransom for many when He offered Himself up to suffer the wrath due His people, and by coming forth alive from death and the grave, He broke the chains of death! He said, "I will redeem them from death!

Not only coming forth alive Himself, but redeeming them (His people) from death. Paul asked the question, "Why should it be thought a thing incredible with you, that God should raise the dead?" God did that very thing, when He raised Himself from death and the grave. Paul told the Church at Corinth, 1st Cor. 15:3 "For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures: And that he was seen of Cephas, then of the twelve: After that, he was seen of above five hundred brethren at once; of whom the greater part remain unto this present, but some are fallen asleep."

The Scriptures, which came by holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost; prophesied of this very fact! It is in harmony and according to the Scriptures that Christ should die and be raised again the third day, from death and the grave! Bible readers, who pay any attention to what they read would not deny that Jesus Christ was crucified, and that He was buried, and on the third morning was raised alive from death and the grave! Jesus said Himself (Rev. 1:18): "I am He that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore. Amen: and have the keys of hell and of death!" Jesus Christ is Lord and Master and is reigning over death and the grave, even has the keys of hell! He is Lord of lord, and King of kings! Jesus Christ has been raised from death and the grave, and this is not called in question or disputed by His Church today! And, as sure as He has been raised from death and the grave, this proves, without question, that all His ransomed and redeemed **will be raised in His likeness and image!**

I Cor. 15: 49-58: "And as we have borne the image of the earthy, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly. Now this I say, brethren, that flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God: neither doth corruption inherit incorruption. Behold, I shew you a mystery; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be change In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality. So when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this mortal shall have put on immortality, then (not before) shall be brought to pass the saying that is written. Death is swallowed up in victory. O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, (because of this) my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord."

If the bodies of God's children are not raised up from death and the grave, and fashioned like the body of Jesus Christ, all the Christian service and labour of love toward God and His people in the Church, and on the outside of the Church, are all in **vain**, and we are yet in our sins and will never see God; because there is not another delivered promised! It is Jesus Christ or nothing! If He has not been raised out of death and the grave, we have no living Saviour to deliver us from death and the grave! It is not **vain** to rejoice in the hope of the resurrection of the dead! "Why should it be thought a thing incredible with you, that God should raise the dead?" In love and hope,



QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Question: Who are the false teachers among the Lord's people, that were to bring in ruinous heresies and pernicious ways which many would follow? (2 Peter 2:1, 2)

Answer: The Apostle Peter says that, as there had been under the Old Testament dispensation, among the people of Israel, false prophets (see 1 Kings 22:11, 12) so there would be, in the New Testament dispensation, among the professed people of God, false teachers (Matt. 24:11; Acts 20:29, 30; Jude 4) who would stealthily bring in, along with some truths, destructive errors, destructive of fundamental principles of the gospel, contradicting even the Lord who they claimed had redeemed them, denying either His divinity or His humanity or His relationship or His messiahship or His atonement or His saving power, and who would bring upon themselves and their followers sudden destruction; and these false teachers are described, in the same chapter, as covetous, presumptuous, vain, corrupts, sensual, and unclean, like dogs and swine. Paul, in Acts 20: 29, 30, describes these same false teachers as grievous wolves, destroying the flock, and speaking perverse things to draw away disciples after them. The apostles, Paul, Peter, and Jude warn us solemnly and earnestly against all such false and highly injurious teachers.

John 2:19: "Jesus answered and said unto them, Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up."

The Temple in the life of an Israelite was a very important thing. It was on his list of highest achievement to walk into the glorious Temple at Jerusalem. It was there where God met with his children and communed with them. At first he met with them in the Tabernacle in the wilderness as we read in the book of Exodus and Leviticus. Then in the days of Solomon, God blessed them with a Temple at Jerusalem. Israel now had a permanent place in the land of milk and honey to worship their precious Lord. This permanent Temple was what the Pharisees thought that Jesus was speaking about when he said temple in our above verse. It took Solomon and Herod considerable more time to build the respected temples of their time. Stone upon stone takes time to erect. Jesus however was not speaking about a temple of stone, but he was speaking about his body (John 2:21). Jesus Christ came into this world as flesh and blood in a body; God literally in the flesh. If they could take his life, then they were destroying a temple. Jesus would raise it again in three days.

We read what Jesus said about this in John 10:18 "No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. This commandment have I received of my Father." Jesus Christ willingly, not by force, laid down his life, and took it back up again. This was the sign he would give them that he was the promised Messiah that Israel was waiting for.

When Jesus said to them "destroy this temple" it was not a command, nor a grant, nor was it an exhortation, but it was a prophesy of what they would do to him. There are other places in the Bible where the body is mentioned as a temple. For example in 1 Corinthians 3:16 "Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?" and in 2 Corinthians 6:16 "And what agreement hath the temple of God with idols? for ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in them: and I will be their God, and they shall be my people." Jesus came in a body, just like his children. Though it looked like a sinful body, yet he was without sin, and in that body he condemned sin (Romans 8:3).

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IS THERE ANYTHING TO DO?

There is an old accusation hurled at Primitive Baptists that they believe in sitting on the stool of "do nothing." While it is true that we can "do nothing" to cause the Lord to save us for heaven's pure world since we are dead in trespasses and sins, it doesn't follow that we are to "do nothing" after being delivered from our death state in sin. The dead cannot do anything; it is only the living that can do something, whether it is natural or spiritual. Isaiah said, "For the grave cannot praise thee, death can not celebrate thee: they that go down into the pit cannot hope for thy truth. The living, the living, he shall praise thee, as I do this day ... " (Isa. 38:18-19). We cannot do anything to extract ourselves from the grave (the earthly grave or grave of death in sin); only the life-giving voice of the Son of God can accomplish this resurrection.

Once life has been instilled, activity can ensue, whether it is natural or spiritual. The Sovereign Grace of God doesn't lead us to sit on the stool of "do nothing." It leads us into active obedience and work in the vineyard of the Lord while we sojourn here below. Once we have stood still and witnessed the salvation of the Lord, it is time to move forward, rather than "do nothing." Primitive Baptists have never taught this, but they may have given that impression by giving emphasis (and rightly so) that we can "do nothing" to save ourselves for heaven. This is God's work and His alone! Some Primitive Baptists may have sat on the stool of "do nothing", but is not because it is taught or preached by their ministers.

Jesus spoke a parable to those that thought the kingdom of God should immediately appear. He spoke of a nobleman who went into a far country to receive a kingdom and return. "And he called his ten servants, and delivered them ten pounds, and said unto them, Occupy till I come." (Luke 19:13). The ten servants were told to "occupy" until the nobleman returned. The word "occupy" means to trade or remain busy. We do not know when our Lord will come the second time to take His ransomed bride home; however, we are to busy ourselves (occupy) until He does. The Lord could come at any time. Peter tells of a day when the heavens shall pass away with a great noise and the elements shall melt with fervent heat. Peter talks about looking and hasting unto this coming day of God. (II Pet. 3:12)

What should be our response to this unknown coming day of God? Peter tells us, "Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, what manner of persons ought ye to be in all holy conversation and godliness," (II Pet. 3:11). If we are going to be this kind of person in holy conversation (behavior) and godliness, we can't remain on the stool of "do nothing." Peter goes on to finish out this third chapter by exhorting the saints to not be led away with the error of the wicked and thus fall from their steadfastness, This is Peter's exhortation: "But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and for ever. Amen." (II Pet. 3:18).

Those pounds that were given to the ten servants were to be used; likewise, we are to use what God has given us to honor Him in our daily walk. This necessitates that we be vigilant in working in the kingdom of God here below. Solomon went by the field of the slothful and considered it well as the vines and nettles had it covered. What was his conclusion as he made this observation? "Yet a little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to sleep: So shall thy poverty come as one that travelleth; and thy want as an armed man." (Prov. 24:33-34). When we fold our hands and just hope the Lord will come soon and take us home, we fail to "occupy" as instructed and are in danger of our adversary, the devil, robbing us of the joy of our salvation. Many of the saints are busy enough and occupying, but they are busy occupying the wrong place. Their hands are active in the world but idle in the Lord's vineyard. What a tragedy! Some people haven't got anything better to do than to occupy the streets and freeways to protest something with which they disagree.

It appears that all forms of civility to any respected office have become a thing of the past. Paul did call Ananias, the high priest, a whited wall and said God would smite him. However, he did so not knowing that he was the high priest because he knew the scripture forbade him to speak evil of the ruler of the people. (Acts 23:3-5). He would charge Timothy to pray for all those in authority. When we have done or are doing our duty as commanded, we are occupying as commanded.

The second coming of the Lord isn't anything to scare anyone into doing what God commands. Rather, it is a great motivation for godly living to honor Him for loving us enough to send His only begotten Son into the world to suffer as the just for the unjust. Jesus was always about His Father's business while on earth; He did what we could never do and that is save us from our sins. We in like manner are to about our Father's business by diligently "occupying" our place in the kingdom, in the church, until the last heir of promise has been quickened into divine life. Then it will be time for the Lord to return from heaven and finally claim His bride.
