FROM THE PASTORS DESK

Fear seems to be running rampant among people in the nation. They fear becoming infected with the corona virus and the possible consequences. They fear the loss of employment and the inability to meet their financial obligations. They may fear man who is bringing so much unnecessary destruction in certain areas of the nation. Of course this fear is being perpetuated by the news media who reports only that which fits their hidden agenda. These fears are very real and genuine but what does the Bible say regarding such fears?

Of course, we realize that we must fear the Lord and revere His holy name. If we do this, we will desire to honor Him in all that we say and do. The wise man Solomon wrote, "The fear of man bringeth a snare: but whoso putteth his trust in the LORD shall be safe." (Prov. 29:25). Much emphasis is being placed on staying safe during this virus pandemic and taking precautions. If we would take as much precautions in staying safe from the traps of Satan as in staying safe from the virus, we would not see as much widespread disdain for Christianity and law and order that is so commonplace.

The word translated safe in Solomon's wisdom does not mean to be safe from danger, disease, or any other enemy. It means "to be set on high and to be strong." When we fear man and all the things that he is capable of doing, we fall into the snare of Satan and have become his prey. Animals caught in a snare have become prey to the one setting the snare. In the case of fear of man, we have set the snare by our own choosing. Man can only kill the body but the Lord is able to destroy both body and soul in hell; therefore, we must fear and reverence Him.

Obviously, when we are weighted down with all the unnecessary fears, we are weak and most vulnerable to Satan's attacks. When we put our trust in the Lord, we are set on high and become strong (safe) as we are abiding under the shadow of the Almighty. Trust in the Lord means to rely and have confidence that He will see us through whatever trial we may encounter in this life. The scriptures are filled with those who trusted in the Lord and did not fear man. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego did not fear the king and his decree and neither did Daniel; they put their trust in the Lord. They did not know the outcome of their trial, but they trusted the One who did know.

When there is danger such as a severe storm that may be approaching, we want to take shelter. What better place to take shelter and refuge from our fears than in the Lord of glory. Solomon also writes and uses the same word "safe" is in Prov. 29:25, "The name of the LORD is a strong tower: the righteous runneth into it, and is safe." (Prov. 18:10). When David went out to fight the giant, Goliath, he castigated Goliath by telling him that he came with just a sword and spear; however, David came "in the name of the LORD of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel." (I Sam. 17:45). We all know the outcome of that battle. David could be strong because he ran into the strong tower of the Lord. David would later write, "For thou hast been a shelter for me, and a strong tower from the enemy." (Psalm 61:3).

It is the "righteous" that runs into the name of the Lord for strength and safety. The wicked have no desire to do anything that would be in any way construed as righteous. Many times it is the wicked that gives cause for the righteous to take shelter in the strong tower of the Lord. Paul was persecuted time and again by the wicked of his own kinsman and also Gentiles but where was his trust and confidence? It was at one time in his own self and the law, but not now, after the Lord had born him again by the Holy Spirit. Paul had troubles galore but he declared, "We are troubled on every side, yet not distressed; we are perplexed, but not in despair; Persecuted, but not forsaken; cast down, but not destroyed;" (II Cor. 4:8-9).

It takes tremendous faith to continue to trust the Lord and run into His strong tower. When we are told to do that which goes against our nature, we must have great faith. Jesus told the apostles that if a brother trespasses against them seven times in a day, and seven times in a day turn again to thee, saying, I repent; they were to forgive him. This was the apostles response, "And the apostles said unto the Lord, Increase our faith." (Luke 17:5). They knew they must have extra reliance on the Lord to perform this command which goes against our nature to strike back rather than forgive.

Lord, increase our faith during this pandemic and any other trials which we may face that we may be safe (strong) and enjoy peace of mind; that we may be free from fear and anxiety, safely sheltered in thy strong tower. A careful study of the bible will eventually disclose that among many other precious truths, it contains three things that stand out in the face of any 1-Creation 2-Redemption objection: and Resurrection. It will also show that the blessed Son of God was intimately connected with all three and the imprint of God's divine nature, sovereignty and purpose is upon them all. First of all, we understand from the Holy Bible that God is the creator and sustainer of all things; only He can create. Men may take matter already created and form certain things but only God can create. In as much as God is the sole creator and cause of the existence of all things He has the right to do with what is his, what He wills to do. Hebrews 1: 3 states plainly that He "Upholds all things by the word of His power". John in the Revelation makes this statement, "Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power; for thou hast created all things and for thy pleasure they are and were created". (Rev. 4:11).

As God is the creator of all things He set his laws in motion for the existence and perpetuity of the creatures of His creation. Men may call them the Laws of Nature but in all reality they are but the Laws of God. After all the centuries of time that have passed, does the Sun still abide in its course by day? Is the Moon light by night still with us? Is there seed time and harvest? You say, that is a silly question and I agree but I ask this question to those who would deny God and his power and say to them "His Counsel stands", His creation abides and will abide until He who created it shall bring it to a close.

Those who agree with us concerning the work of creation may not agree so much concerning the work of redemption. The work of redemption and salvation is just as much over-seen by God as was his creative work in the beginning. Man violated God's Holy Law and by the disobedience of that One man Adam all men received a just sentence of death. (Rom:5:12). A man violated God's Law therefore a man must pay the penalty that God's Law demands. So in the work of Redemption the Son of God (the man Christ Jesus) stood in our stead and became sin for us (2nd Cor. 5:21) and obtained eternal redemption for us. (Read Hebrews 9). God's purpose was just as sure in this plan of redemption as it was in creation. Nothing was out of place. God's intent or purpose was to redeem those whom He gave to the Son (St. Jn.6:38-39). They are by nature dead in sin (2nd Cor. 5:14, Eph. 2:1-3). They are born dead in sin, they live dead in sin, they will die dead in Sin and go to Hell dead in Sin UNLESS THE LORD BY HIS CREATIVE HAND does a creative work. This is a creative work in the new birth; a quickening bringing us to Life in Christ and instilling in the heir of promise a new nature. Then there is a continuing conflict like two great armies at war one with the other but this is not an over-haul of the Old man. It is a new creation. (2nd Cor. 5:17).

The Resurrection from the dead proved that Christ was who He said He was. Rom. 1:1-4. Wicked men crucified him. I can leave no room for doubt that the wicked actions of men are voluntary willful violations of God's holy and righteous Law and that men are wholly responsible completely and accountable to God for such actions. When Wicked hands crucified the Lord of Glory men did what they wanted to do. God does not force or compel the wicked to act wickedly. It is inherent for them to act according to their own evil nature. Just as it is for the Dog to return to his vomit and the sow to her wallowing in the mire. However, God may, can and does, take at His discretion men, angels or anything else He may please to fulfill his purposes and bring to pass his designs. Ps. 33:9 says "For He spake and it was done; He commanded and it stood fast".

Notice; "He spake" (the cause) "and it was done" (the effect); "He commanded" (the cause) "and it stood fast" (the effect).

God is not obligated to explain any of this to us and admittedly much of it is beyond our ability to explain. God help us not to try to explain away what we do not understand or that which may be beyond our ability to explain. May we let the Bible say what it says and believe what it says. Think of it in the context of the potter. Does the pot say to the potter "Well you know that I had a little something to do with what I am". Well of course such a thing does not happen but that is exactly the position of the Arminian with polish taken off of it. He tells the sinner to do something the Lord said He cannot do. The clay has nothing to do with the process. The potter seeks out the clay, brings it to his house and molds it according to his own vision. This is how the "Divine Potter" deals with us. Paul illustrated the fact in Rom. 9:20, "nay but O man, who art thou that repliest against God? Shall the thing formed say to him that formed it, why hast thou made me thus? Hath not the potter POWER OVER THE CLAY, of the same lump to make one vessel unto honour and another unto dishonor?" We are His WORKMANSHIP (Eph. 2:9-10), His work, the masterful work of a God who knows no bounds, in other words, HIS PRODUCT. It literally means "For of Him we are a product". The world says we are a product of our environment or a product of our own experience and I know that such has an effect on the natural man to some degree. But in the work of Redemption, Creation and Resurrection we are actually the products of God through Christ; Not of our Will or some co-operative effort with the church, the preacher, our talent or religious out-reach. William Cowper wrote 275 years ago and we sing in every hymn book: "God Moves in a mysterious way His wonders to perform; He plants His footsteps in the sea and rides upon the storm. 2-Deep in unfathomable mines of never failing skill, He treasures up His bright designs and works His sovereign Will 3-His purposes will ripen fast unfolding every hour, the bud may have a bitter taste but sweet will be the flower". AMEN.

John 8:45 KJV "And because I tell you the truth, ye believe me not."

Why should the Pharisees not believe that Jesus was the son of God? They were having a conversation in his very presence, some had even witnessed his abilities, and still many more had heard of his power to heal. So why did they doubt him? The simple answer is, they had no ability to believe.

Believing on Jesus is not just a matter of hearing and seeing with the natural senses. We of our own natural selves have no desire to seek or listen or to understand unnatural things, nor ability. Something from within us must change in order for those senses to be operative. In other words that soul which is dead to the things of God must be regenerated. God must send his spirit into us, and revive that which cannot revive itself. Bringing life where only death existed.

Jesus himself explained the new birth to Nicodemus, yet he was not able to comprehend. Consequently many of God's children do not comprehend as well. However he gave him this comforting thought, the wind bloweth where it listeth, thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell from whence it comes, nor whither it goest, so is everyone born of the spirit. The activation comes at the discretion of God, and that activation will bring a noticeable difference in our lives. The question remains will we quench the spirit or feed it?

Quenching the spirit brings about a miserable existence, because we are not satisfied with the life we hold onto, and we will not reach out for the life to be enjoyed. However this does not change the work of Christ on the cross, nor the work of the spirit within, both are immutable. It does affect what and how we believe. Because we fail to act on the faith provided, we tend to believe that we ourselves possess a power of our own, that is not of God. We feel the ability to hold him at bay, that we can tell him what he can and cannot do, where he may and may not go. We feel in control of all things in of ourselves.

A man named Nebuchadnezzar once thought along those same lines. He boasted to all his kingdom of the works done by his own hand. After spending about 7 years walking about like a donkey, with gnarled feet, fur like eagles feather, and eating grass, he was brought to the point that he declared that God works his will in the army of heaven and among the inhabitants of the earth, and none can stay his hand, or say unto him, what doest thou?

Our belief is further affected by our dedication to study and meditation. And to what principles we hold in regard to that study. For instance: is God absolutely sovereign; is man by nature completely depraved; did Jesus attempt to save his people; is salvation based on a chance system or by an act of pure grace; Can man save himself by the works of the law; does water baptism unlock the gates of heaven for us; are there multiple ways of eternal salvation, and does it depend upon our circumstance? The answer that we derive from these questions will ultimately decode what we believe.

However if we are diligent in our course of study and we find something that contradicts our beliefs, we have a few choices to make. We can overlook the revelation and dismiss it. We can make it say what we desire, so that it will coincide with what we believe. Or we can change our belief to that of God's? Most often we do not opt for the third choice, because it challenges our preconceived ideas, or more to the point it tells us that we have been wrong. So will we harmonize the word of God that we may know and believe his truth, or will we dismiss and overlook it? Will we be like the Pharisees, that did not believe no matter what, or will we be like the disciples of the early church desiring to know more about Jesus?

Our prayer today is that we be like the Bereans. May we study the scriptures that we may know the truth. That we would cherish the revelation of God's word in our lives. That we may know and understand all that we can of what God has done for us in this life and the life to come. Amen.

QUESTIONS ABOUT OUR ARTCILES OF FAITH (Number One)

In the first place, there are those that question the need, or propriety, of having articles of faith at all. "Why not just let the Bible speak for us?" they ask. Now, that may sound very appealing to simplicity of thinking, but a moment's reflection will show the insufficiency of such a solution. Most professed Christians also profess to believe the Bible and contend that is the source of their belief. Yet, what they believe is so divergent that, for one to simply say, "I believe what the Bible teaches," tells you absolutely nothing about WHAT they believe about any particular subject in the Bible. The important question is, what do you believe the Bible to teach? What is the MEANING of certain passages, verses, words? To illustrate the point rather dramatically, where can you find a Primitive Baptist that will tell you that John 3:16 can be taken at face value and expresses what he believes without any explanation at all? Now, just in case this may fall under the scrutiny of some Arminian, I will ask you a question: Who among you would be willing to take Romans 9:13, "...Jacob have I love, (sic) but Esau have I hated." at face value without any explanation? These examples could be multiplied a hundredfold and will suffice to show that, before you can tell anything about what a person believes, Biblically speaking, you must know something about what he thinks it teaches on some definite subject. Therefore, in setting forth the distinguishing characteristics of the "...belief of any religious group," "Articles of Faith" serve a very useful purpose. Furthermore, they are a great help to anyone, or group, in studying the Bible on various subjects. Also to test their faith by the Bible itself, if they have the fortitude to do so!

Secondly, I believe it is in complete harmony with Apostolic precept and example to "...set forth in order a declaration of those things which are most surely believed among us..." (Luke 1:1) Of course, this could be done by expounding the Holy Scriptures themselves on all points of one's belief. But this would take so much time and/or space that few people would take the time to read, or listen, as the case might be. On the other hand, that would require a profundity that but very, very few men possess! The only alternative is to "set forth in order a declaration" in an abbreviated form. If you do this in the briefest way possible to be understood, what you have are "Articles of Faith"—you may call it whatever you please!

Many people are discouraged by lengthy articles. So, in order to encourage and invite attention to this subject, I am going to let this suffice for this time and try to have some more to say about it at a later date. Incidentally, I just made another point in favor of "Articles of Faith." –("Christian Pathway" in "Autobiography of Elder Virgil F. Lowrance")

"There shall be an handful of corn in the earth upon the top of the mountains; the fruit there of shall shake like Lebanon: And they of the city shall flourish like grass of the earth." (Psalm 92:16--Editor) This in the type has to do with the church, followers of God. "Handful" doesn't always have reference to a small amount. It sometimes has reference to abundance. During the days of Joseph in Egypt in the years of plenty, the earth brought handfuls, and he stored up enough to take care of the lean years to comehence abundance. I suppose you remember reading in the book of Ruth that she went into the field and gathered or gleaned corn, and some handfuls of purpose by the servants. The corn is found on top of mountain, above the weak and beggarly elements of life. Corn is recognized as food. In the long ago they ate corn parched and other ways. The gospel is recognized as food, "Feed my sheep." Feed them with knowledge and with understanding. Natural food never gave life, neither does spiritual food give spiritual life, but it is very useful for those who have life. The church is spoken of as being established in the top of the mountains, and is often referred to as a mountain-mount of the Lord, the Holy mountain. The fruit thereof shall shake like Lebanon. The word "shake" carries with it movement-life is motion-lively stones. "And they of the city shall flourish like grass of the earth." When we think of the fruit or grain flourishing, we look upon it as growing, bringing forth the bud and the bloom, then the matured grain. They of the city are not grass, but are like the grass that flourished on the earth.

The church is spoken of as the city of truth. The Lord said that the poor shall have the gospel preached unto them. While the Lord was here on the earth in person, multitudes gathered about Him. The question came up as to how they could be fed. The answer came by one of the disciples. A lad here has five barley loaves and two small fishes; but what is this for so many. The Lord took the five barley loaves and the two small fishes and blessed them and then gave to the disciples. So all were fed, and afterwards they took up twelve baskets of the fragments that nothing be lost. There is so to speak an handful; but when blessed, it was an abundance. This is a part of the provision made for the church of God here in time. When this corn is found it will be on top of the mountains. Elder A. D. Wood

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q. Have any certain knowledge as to the color of Adam?

A. We have not. It is thought that the Hebrew word Adam is derived from the Hebrew words meaning "formed of red earth," and that, therefore, Adam was a white man with the ruddy complexion of health. As the Jews are traced back, in the Scriptures, through Abraham and Shem and Noah to Adam, the latter must have been a white man. The word Ham, the name of Noah's younger son, is thought to mean "black" or "hot;" he was the ancestor of the people in the southern warm countries of Asia and Africa, Arabia, Egypt and Ethiopia. The word Ethiopia means suburnt. In accordance with Acts 17:26, Rom. 5:12, I Cor. 15:22, and Rev. 5:9, nearly all scientists agree that the whole human race descended from one pair, and that the races have been, in the overruling providence of God, brought about by differences, of thousands of years, in climate, temperature, moisture, exposure, and environment. We know from the Scriptures (Psalm 68:31; Acts 8:26-40), and are assured, from experience and observation, that Ethiopians are subjects of Divine grace. No human reasoning can exempt any variety of mankind from accountability to God, and from condemnation by His justice or salvation by His mercy.

CAN GOD SAVE THE INSANE?

-- Comments On A Radio Sermon --Elder C. H. Cayce –The Primitive Baptist – February 6, 1936

A few nights ago, we listened to a sermon over the radio. We did not get the name of the speaker. If we correctly understood the announcement, the broadcast came from some other church by a hookup in Fort Worth [TX].

The preacher was strongly urging the unregenerate to "get right with God" before it is everlastingly too late." He told a number of things which might happen to one who is unsaved so that his salvation would be utterly impossible; it would be everlastingly too late for him to ever be saved.

One thing he told his listeners that would make it absolutely impossible for them to ever be saved was that they might lose their right mind; they might become insane; their reason might be dethroned. And, he said, "When reason is dethroned, your opportunity for heaven is gone."

We do not know what denomination this man is identified with, nor do we know his name...He is not a Primitive Baptist—of this we are fully aware. But from his discourse and statement, we get the idea that he holds that God cannot save an insane person; God cannot save a person whose reason is dethroned. What a poor idea this man has of the God of the Bible, the God of Abraham and of Isaac and of Jacob, the God of Israel.

We thought of the two who were possessed of devils that we read about in Mat. 8:28:

And when he was come to the other side of the country of the Gergesenes, there met him two possessed with devils, coming out of the tombs, exceeding fierce, so that no man might pass that way.

Here were two persons who were so fierce and so insane that "...no man might pass that way." Here were two fellows that no preacher could get to. The preacher could not get to them by radio in that day. They had no radio then!

They were in a deplorable state—so deplorable that they could not be reached by the preachers or any of the devices of men. And, according to what the preacher said over the radio, the Lord Himself could not save them! Their reason was dethroned, and their opportunity for heaven was forever gone.

It is true that, so far as the efforts of men are concerned, they had no opportunity for heaven. So far as the works and efforts of men are concerned, no man would have any opportunity for heaven.

...With men this is impossible;...[Mat. 19:26]. With men, it IS impossible to be saved. (From "The Christian Baptist", Sept./Oct. 2003)

There is no holiness in being persuaded. King Agrippa was almost persuaded to be a Christian. The honor to the King and the holiness is when the action is taken. Thus, if we are persuaded and do not embrace them, we have taken no action. In failing to take action, we cast doubts on whether we are even persuaded.

Then when the final dot is connected it brings us to the confession. When we are persuaded and embrace the sweet blessings and promises of the Lord, we gladly confess that we are strangers and pilgrims here. In other words, we realize this world is not our home, heaven is. We understand better what the Apostle meant when he said to be absent from you is to be present with the Lord.

If every child who heard the message of grace and was persuaded by it, connected the next dot in the picture of life, and embraced it, our church houses would be full and more would be bringing forth one hundred fold.

My oldest brother used to pick his guitar and sing a song that had the words, "If I could turn back the pages of time, I'd give all I own..." How many times have you thought about how much better you could have done, if you had sought the pleasures in the Lord, rather than the pleasures of life? How much sooner would you have joined the Church if you could turn back the pages of time?

Luke 7:42: An excerpt from the parable of the Two Debtors in Luke 7:36-50. "And when they had nothing to pay, he frankly forgave them both. Tell me therefore, which of them will love him most?"

Thus the guestion is given to Simon the Pharisee at the conclusion of the story of two men, who were forgiven by their creditor that both owed him money. One owed 50 pence the other 500 pence. Neither one could pay their creditor. The creditor then forgave both the debtors of their debt, paid in full though they had no money. The Lord asked Simon "who will love him the most?" Simon's reply was "I suppose the one he forgave the most." The one who owed five hundred pence. This is a story to teach us humility and gratitude we should have toward our blessed Lord who forgave us of a huge debt that we could never repay. Romans 12:3 "For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith."
