FROM THE PASTORS DESK

It is commanded in scripture that we forsake not the assembling of ourselves together as a body of believers in Christ. (Heb. 10:25). However, the virus named COVID-19 that has devastated the country and the world has necessitated that the church not assemble together to avoid the spread of this overly deadly disease that seems to spread in proximity of close human contact. Some times we don't realize how precious something is until we no longer have access to it.

I am reminded of Israel who had been carried away into Babylonian captivity with no longer any access to Zion's blessings. The Bible tells us, "By the rivers of Babylon, there we sat down, yea, we wept, when we remembered Zion." (Psa.137:1) Their tears seemed to mirror the waters by which they sat as they mourned their lot. The Psalmist goes on to relate their situation, "We hanged our harps upon the willows in the midst thereof. For there they that carried us away captive required of us a song; and they that wasted us required of us mirth, saying, Sing us one of the songs of Zion. How shall we sing the LORD'S song in a strange land?" (Psa. 137:2-4)

The Israelites were in a strange land and it was difficult to sing the Lord's song in the strange land of Babylon. Zion's gates had been destroyed by the king that had taken them captive and here they were in captivity and unable to worship as they formerly did. We are not in as bad a situation as the Israelites because we aren't in physical captivity but are captive for concern of contracting or spreading the disease. Actually we are captive of restrictions that say "stay home". This is a strange land but we can still sing a song and worship in a manner today unavailable to those in that day via various media.

Perhaps there were some children of God who had neglected to assemble with the saints prior to COVID-19 but now restrictions are in place which prevents them from assembling. Do they now shed tears over their situation as did Israel? It would be good if they did and remedy the situation when the saints can once again assemble without concern of contacting or spreading disease. No wonder they remembered Zion because it is "Beautiful for situation, the joy of the whole earth, is mount Zion, on the sides of the north, the city of the great King. God is known in her palaces for a refuge." (Psa. 48:2-3)

There is an old saying, "There's no place like home" and how true that is. It is good to visit friends and neighbors but it is always good to be back home, particularly if we have been away for awhile. The church is home to the people of God who have taken up their cross and followed the Lord; it is also home to those lingering on the outskirts of the city of Zion but do not know the full blessings while residing on the outside. The prodigal son found out there was no place like home but he didn't learn that until he had wasted his substance in riotous living. When he was in want, he remembered how it was at home with his father where there was bread enough to spare.

We have three homes I believe in the scriptures. We have our natural home with father, mother and children. This home required a forsaking to establish as Jesus said, "For this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife: and they twain shall be one flesh?" (Matt. 19:5) We have also a church home that is analogous to our natural home as Paul writes, "For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother, and shall be joined unto his wife, and they two shall be one flesh. This is a great mystery: but I speak concerning Christ and the church." (Eph. 5:31-32) We are not to neglect our natural home of family; neither are we to neglect our church family because to do so places us in peril.

In addition to our natural home and church home, we have a heavenly home where there will be no COVID-19 or any other disease that will invade and it is also referred to in scripture as an inheritance. Peter writes that he was begotten again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Christ "To an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you," (I Pet. 1:4) That home by inheritance required the sacrifice of Jesus Christ and all will be assembled to praise the Lord without the absence of any member chosen in Christ before the foundation of the world.

That heavenly home will not be a strange land and it will be easy to sing the Lord's song, "And they sung a new song, saying, Thou art worthy to take the book, and to open the seals thereof: for thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us to God by thy blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation;" (Rev. 5:9) While we wait for that great eternal day to come, let us not forsake our assemblies when we have the opportunity to attend. 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AMBASSADORS

Elder C. H. Cayce (Deceased)

And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation; To wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation. Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God.—2 Cor. v. 18-20.

What *all things are of God*? Does that expression mean that all things which exist are of God? We think not. The all things in this verse are the same all things which are mentioned in verse 17: "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature; old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new." The same all things which are become new are of God; and then the apostle says, "who hath reconciled us to Himself." "Hath reconciled" is in the past tense; it is something which has already been done. No part of that work of reconciling us to Himself is accomplished in the future, either by what we do, or by what the church does, or by what the sinner does. It has already been accomplished; it has been finished; it has been completed. This work was fully accomplished—fully done—by Jesus Christ—not by Jesus Christ and the preacher; not by Jesus Christ and the sinner; not by Jesus Christ and the church; not by Jesus Christ and any society or set of men under heaven—but by Jesus Christ alone.

Then He "hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation." The ministry of reconciliation is the

work of a servant, in the sense of an ambassador, for he says we "are ambassadors". It is therefore, [pg137] necessarily true that the work of the minister, or of the ministry, has no part in the work of reconciling. That has already been done; God has already "reconciled us to Himself by Jesus Christ." Now, having already done this, He gives to men, of His own choosing and calling, the ministry of reconciliation. Their work is to tell what the Lord has already done, which is "that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto Himself." God was manifest in the flesh; Christ was God manifest in the flesh. God accomplished the work of reconciling His people unto Himself. He did that work in Christ. He did not impute their trespasses unto them. Their sins were not charged to them. Their trespasses were imputed to Christ. Their sins were charged to Him, for He was their surety. As He was their surety, He took their law place. He was responsible for all their transgressions, all their sins. They were all imputed to Him; they were charged to Him. As such, He met all the demands of the law for them and in their stead. When the demands of the law were thus met, the just and righteous law of God was satisfied; and thus He reconciled us to Himself by Jesus Christ. No wonder, then, this same apostle could, and did say: "For if when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of His Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by His life."—Rom. v. 10. In the original language the expression, being reconciled, is in the past tense; so in our present day English it strictly means "having been reconciled."

Now, God having done this, He has given to us the ministry of reconciliation—that is He "hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation." He has not committed unto us the *work* of reconciliation, but the [pg 138] *word* of it. He has placed upon somebody the duty and the obligation to tell the news of what the Lord has done. To do this is to proclaim glad tidings; it is to tell the good news. It is to tell the Lord's humble poor, those for whom Jesus laid down His life, that He has made perfect and full and complete satisfaction for all their sins; they have been reconciled to God by Jesus Christ. Having been reconciled to God by Jesus Christ, He having met all the demands of the law for them, and the law having been fully satisfied, they are sure to finally enjoy all the bliss and the glory of the heavenly world.

This all being true, now "we are ambassadors for Christ." It is not the business or work of an ambassador to persuade persons to cease to be citizens and subjects of one country and to become citizens or subjects of another or foreign country. If the United States should have an ambassador in Germany, or in any other foreign country, who should begin to endeavor to persuade the subjects of that government to renounce allegiance to that country and to become subjects of the United States, not only

would that foreign government send him out of that country immediately, but he would immediately be recalled by the United States government. That is not the work or business of an ambassador.

“Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us.” The Lord sent us to you; we are messengers whom He has sent, and He sent us to you. The work we are to do is to beseech you, plead with you, to persuade you—not to persuade you as aliens, to cease to be citizens and subjects of [pg139] Satan in his kingdom, and to become citizens and subjects of the Lord’s kingdom, or to become children of God. They were sent to the Corinthian brethren, not to the aliens in that country, or in any other country. In this letter the apostle wrote to the “church of God which is at Corinth, with all the saints which are in all Achaia.”—2 Cor. i. 1. The Lord sent them as ambassadors to His own people who are dwelling here below, in a foreign country. This country is not their home; their home is in heaven, and they are fellow-citizens with the saints and of the household of God. But some of them had been deluded, and, so, were divided. Now this I say, that every one of you saith, I am of Paul: and I of Apollos; and I of Cephas. They claimed that the preacher had something with their being saved, or being made children of God. They did not say, “I am for” the preacher, but “I am of” the preacher. To be of Paul is one thing, and to be for Paul is another thing. They are two different things entirely. One may be for England in the present conflict between this country and Germany, and yet be not of England. If the Corinthians were of Paul, then they should be baptized in the name of Paul. They were not baptized in the name of Paul, but in the name of the Lord—in the name of the Trinity. Hence, the apostle, as an ambassador sent of God, would beseech them to be reconciled to God—to give up the false notion or idea that the preacher or the church, or society, or any set of men, or their [pg140] own doings, had anything in the world to do with their eternal salvation, or had anything in the world to do with their birth from above, or to do with their sins being removed. “Be ye reconciled to God.” Be satisfied with what He has done for you. Do not be trying to do, or trying to get done, what the Lord has already accomplished for you in the finished work of the crucified and risen Redeemer.

If all the Lord’s children were reconciled to God, were satisfied with the Lord’s work, what He has done, and what He commands His children to do, they would stop the work many of them are trying to engage in, in “saving souls,” and trying to “take the world for Christ”, trying to help sinners to be born again, and would be coming home to the Old Baptist Church; and then they would be busy doing what the Lord has commanded to be done in His church by His children. . . .

THANKFUL FOR WHAT WE KNOW

There are many things that we do not know in this life but it should not hinder our faith in the Lord. We do not know what a day may bring forth so we are to live our lives day by day with a trust in the Lord. We do not know what the future holds for us or our family in this life but we trust in the Lord to provide. However, there are things we can know and of which we can be completely assured.

Can we know that we are children of God? The Bible says that we can as we listen to John writing, “We know that we have passed from death unto life, because we love the brethren. He that loveth not his brother abideth in death.” (I John 3:14) If we have passed from death (unborn again), to life (born again), we are children of God by birth in addition to being children of God by choice (chosen in Christ) and by purchase (by blood of Jesus). Nicodemus said that “we know that thou art a teacher come from God, for no man can do these miracles except God be with him.” (John 3:2). Nicodemus knew this much more than by a physical witness because the Lord hath revealed unto him the truth that Jesus came from God but there were many things Nicodemus did not know at this juncture in his life.

We often don’t know what to pray for as we ought. We know we should pray but exactly what to pray for sometimes is difficult to express to God in prayer. The Holy Spirit inspired Paul to eliminate this dilemma when he wrote, “...for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.” (Rom. 8:26) What a comfort!

We don’t know exactly what it will be like in heaven but we can know by faith what the final culmination of all things will be. The apostle John again states, “Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is.” (I John 3:2). We are thankful for the truth of salvation by grace that makes us free. Jesus said, “And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.” (John 8:32).

Paul knew about a treasure he had in his earthen vessel but he also knew there was something beyond this vale of tears. He said, “For we know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.” (II Cor. 5:1)

We can know more by reading and studying the scriptures but what we know now in this life doesn’t compare with what we will know in heaven and immortal glory. So brothers and sisters, we should be extremely thankful for what we know concerning ourselves and the Lord Jesus Christ but be willing to grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ—*Editor*

SPECIAL WORLD

For God sent not His Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through Him might be saved.—John iii. 17

I do not know just what good I may get from this Scripture, but take what I may say and compare it with “thus saith the Bible,” and see if it be found the truth. The main thought in this saying is the Son, and what God, His Father, sent Him into this low ground of sin and sorrow to do. The verse before this, as well as this one, is a pet text among most of the religious people. Because the world, “world.” Is used, it is taken to mean all the Adamic race. But we will find Scripture to prove that this world which Jesus, the Son of God, came to save is not the whole Adamic race, but a special world. Jesus used the word, “world,” again in John xvii. 9, when He said, “I pray for them; I pray not for the world, but for them which thou hast given me; for they are thine.” We find that Jesus prayed not for the world. So this word, “world,” must have a different meaning, or else the Scriptures fail to harmonize. Then since all Scripture is given by the inspiration of God, it must be the truth and in harmony.

When Jesus said that He prayed not for the world, He meant the world of alien sinners, the ones who are separated from God by the transgression of Adam. These know nothing of God, are not subject to the law of God. When Jesus said, “I pray for them,” I believe He had in mind the same ones whom our text speaks about where it says that through Him might be save. These are the ones the Father gave Him in the covenant. Jesus says, “For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of Him that sent me. And this is the Father’s will which has sent me, that of all which He hath given me I should lose nothing, but raise it up again at the last day.” We find this is a special world, which God the Father gave to the Son back in the annals of eternity, before the dust of the highest hills was laid. Yes, dear readers, here is where our salvation began. We, who feel the love of our Savior in our hearts, who hate the evil of this world, are the world which Jesus had in mind when He said that the world through Him might be saved. We find that God had this same world in mind when He instructed Moses to lead the Israelites out of Egypt. We find that God kept Pharaoh, and his people from following the Israelites, for these, of Pharaoh, represented the world which is against God.

John iii. 17 is considered as a possible salvation by most people. I believe that this is a sure salvation to the world under consideration. Jesus said that he came to do the Father’s will, and if He fails to save all the Father gave Him, then He has not carried out the Father’s will; therefore, the covenant is broken, and the whole plan of God has failed? God created the

natural sun and stars; have they failed? The Lord showed a promise to Abraham when the ram appeared in the thicket. This promise was fulfilled when Jesus hung his head on the cross and said, “It is finished.” What was finished? The work which His Father gave Him to do when the covenant was made. How far does His power extend? It embraces all the Father willed to be saved. The prophet said, “It shall be in that day, that living waters shall go out from Jerusalem; half of them toward the former sea, and half of them toward the hinder sea: in summer and in winter shall it be.” I believe this tells how far the Saviour’s life-giving blood, which is the living waters, extends. The former sea is the time from the cross back to Adam, and the hinder sea is the time from the cross to the last one who will ever be born. "As it was Determined" Luke 22:22

Just after Jesus had blessed the bread and wine, as he and his closest followers were in that upper room, Jesus makes this statement, "But, behold the hand of him that betrayeth me is with me on the table. And truly the Son of Man goeth, AS IT WAS DETERMINED." Luke 22:21-22. The word DETERMINED simply means "marked out BY A BOUND OR LIMIT". The way of the Son of Man was marked by the PLAN of God, by the Hand of God, in God's time, in God's way and by the means which God had ordained; AS IT WAS DETERMINED. The same word is used in Acts 17:26 as Paul preached at Mars Hill. He says to those ignorant wise men that God "Hath made of one blood all nations of men for to dwell on all the face of the earth, and hath DETERMINED the times BEFORE APPOINTED, and the BOUNDS of their habitation;". In Acts 2:23-24 Peter, in that Great Pentecostal sermon says, "Him being delivered by the DETERMINATE counsel and foreknowledge of God; Ye (not me) have taken and by wicked hands have crucified and slain; whom God hath raised up, having loosed the pains of death; BECAUSE IT WAS NOT POSSIBLE THAT HE SHOULD BE HOLDEN OF IT". In Acts 4:26-28 Peter and John were commanded not to SPEAK or TEACH in the name of Jesus after the healing of the 40 year old lame man in Acts chapter three. But they continued to speak of how rulers, kings, Herod, Pontius Pilate, Jews and Gentiles were gathered together "FOR TO DO WHATSOEVER THY HAND AND THY COUNSEL DETERMINED BEFORE TO BE DONE".

All that Christ accomplished was before-ordained or MARKED OUT with certain BOUNDS determined by the plan and counsel of a holy God. Like the HORIZON or a BOUNDARY LINE. 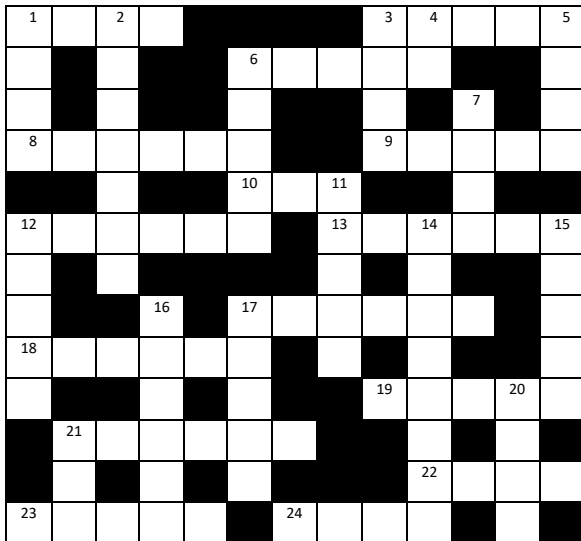
Nothing was altered in this plan or determination. What wicked men did could not change or alter the bounds that God had ordained. As it was written in

NO CONTRADICTION

Many who would try to discredit the Bible, and especially the writings of Paul, think they have found a conflict in Romans 9:27 and Romans 11:26.

I find these two scriptures to be really good proof texts for the doctrine of conditional time salvation, and also the doctrine of eternal salvation by grace and grace alone. Let us look at these two scriptures. Romans 9:27: "Though the number of the children of Israel be as the sand of the sea, a remnant shall be saved."

Then in the very next chapter, Paul has this to say: "Brethren, my hearts desire and prayer to God for Israel is, that they might be saved." Paul was one of the most prolific teachers of the doctrine of salvation by grace, and yet, he is here praying for his brethren, the Israelites that they might be saved. If we read just a little further we discover what salvation Paul is having reference to; salvation from trying to establish their own righteousness, and not submitting themselves to the righteousness of God.

I submit to you that this is a continuation of the lesson in Romans 9:27. How often do we see this happening even to this present day? Many of the Lord's people think they have to, by their good works, establish their own righteousness, when in reality, the only righteousness any of us can plead, is the imputed righteousness of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Paul was praying that they realize that they are "not all Israel which are of Israel" Romans 9:6, simply stated, that not all Israelites are the chosen of God in the covenant of grace. I believe here, however, that Paul is dealing with Spiritual Israel. Common reasoning would tell us that he would not be praying for those we would term the "non-elect." The remnant that shall be saved, we believe to be referring to that small number of the Lord's people who will sometime during this lifetime, embrace the truth of the imputed righteousness of our Lord Jesus Christ. In so doing, there is a great salvation here in time, from the false doctrines of this world, and from the pitfalls of Satan.

In Romans 11:26; "And so all Israel shall be saved: as it is written, There shall come out of Sion the Deliverer, and shall turn away ungodliness from Jacob." Jesus and Paul both frequently used the phrase: "as it is written." When we see this phrase, it is in our best interest, and that of the people we serve, to find where it is written. In this reference, we need to look at Isaiah 45:17: "But Israel shall be saved in the Lord with an everlasting salvation: ye shall not be ashamed nor confounded world without end." The apostle Paul or the prophet Isaiah do not leave us to guess which salvation is under consideration.

The conclusion we draw here is that Paul is dealing with the elect of God in both Romans 9:27, and Romans 11:26. As my dear mother used to tell me, "until we can see that there are two salvations taught in the scriptures, they appear to be one contradiction after another." The scriptures do not contradict themselves. They are written in perfect harmony. I am confident that is why Paul told the young minister, Timothy to: "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly divided the world of truth." 2 Timothy 2:15. All of the inspired word of God is truth. Paul said nothing about dividing truth from error. It is our duty as ministers of the gospel, to spend time every day in study and in prayer, that we may properly present these lessons to the Lord's people. These are just some of my thoughts on these scriptures. As always, I would have you put these thoughts to the test of the Bible. If they stand, then accept them, if not then lay them aside. May the Lord's blessing be yours to enjoy.

Romans 16:3-4: "Greet Priscilla and Aquila my helpers in Christ Jesus: Who have for my life laid down their own necks: unto whom not only I give thanks, but also all the churches of the Gentiles."
